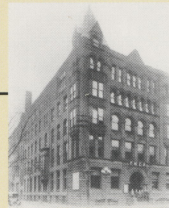
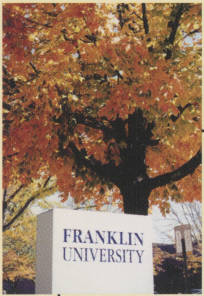

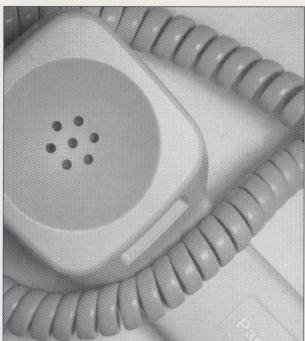

CAMPUS PROGRESS



Last spring Franklin University invited the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Accreditation Association (NCA) to campus to provide an understanding and objective review of the changes underway at our University.

The following excerpts are taken directly from the NCA report.

Changes since 1998:

- Degrees awarded increased 53%
- Graduate degrees awarded increased 174%
- Part-time faculty grew 82%
- Ratio of part-time faculty to full-time faculty grew 97%
- Course sections offered grew 49%
- 15-week course sections decreased 16%
- All other course sections grew 285%
- Online course sections grew 616%
- Community College Alliance (CCA) member schools grew from 13 to 178
- CCA member states grew from 3 to 28

Faculty

The faculty exhibit a clear understanding of the changes that have occurred, the rationale for those changes, the future direction of the faculty model, and the model for curriculum development and delivery.

Faculty roles and responsibilities within the University are well defined and are embraced by the faculty as a whole. Faculty clearly feel they have input through the faculty governance system, and that they are indeed the primary drivers of change, both in content and pace.

The program for faculty development, both for full-time and part-time faculty, is exemplary. This in part explains the singleness of vision and purpose that the team observed in meeting with faculty both individually and within groups. There is a dedication to continuous improvement that guides both curriculum content and delivery.

Curriculum

Over the past five years, Franklin University has engaged in a comprehensive review and realignment of its curriculum. The changes flowing from this process take several specific forms. First, Franklin reasserted the primacy of its applied and professional programs and its dedication to operating in a business-like manner. The institution has been particularly attuned to enrollment patterns and employer need.

Second, the institution now relies upon a distinctive design process to develop, deliver and evaluate all courses offered more than five times a year anywhere within the University. This model, introduced initially in Franklin's

distance education program (CCA), enjoys the enthusiastic support of faculty, administrators and trustees.

The advisory team found Franklin's full-time faculty to be articulate and enthusiastic champions of these curricular changes. Discussions revealed a genuine confidence in the efficacy of the course design (and redesign) model. Indeed the system does provide Franklin with a distinctive opportunity to draw upon student assessment data to continuously improve individual courses in particular and the curriculum in general.

Although most courses are now offered in a compressed time format, content coverage and academic standards have clearly not been compromised, largely as a function of the integrity of the course design model.

Attention to giving students what they need, not just what they want ("customer is not always right") is a significant positive.

Perceptions of the institution (by the Advisory Team)

The institution must recognize that the non-traditional path brings a (disproportionate) burden regarding the demonstration of excellence (especially within the higher education community); this is not "fair" but true; Franklin must accept this and get on with it; pioneers have a tough role.

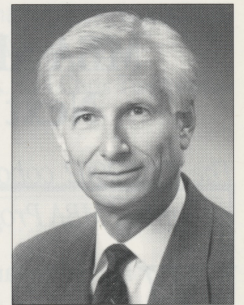
Recommendations

In the end, the picture of Franklin University which emerged to the Advisory Visit Team was that of an institution which has undergone extraordinary recent change, which exhibits a clear and shared sense of purpose even in the midst of change; and which is well-positioned to continue serving learners and advancing its mission. The Advisory Visit Team unearthed no evidence that Franklin University fails to comply with any of the General Institutional Requirements or fails to satisfy any of the criteria for accreditation. Accordingly, the team recommends that the institution's next comprehensive visit remain scheduled for 2007-2008.

Afterword — by Paul Otte

As you can see from the above report, your University is growing (in both degrees awarded and course offerings). Our academic model is sound and the quality of our academic programs is very high.

We are (and have been for 100 years) following a nontraditional path and in the words of the advisory team, "pioneers have a tough role." We encourage you to help us tell our story. Let everyone know that you are an alum of Franklin University and proud of your alma mater. •

MBA Alumni Benefit from Next Generation MBA

The Fall 2002 cohort is the first to experience Franklin's revamped MBA Program.

With an enhanced emphasis on courses, curriculum and professional effectiveness, students will be exposed to critical success factors essential for tomorrow's business leaders.

Students can select one of the new discipline tracks focusing on Entrepreneurship, Leadership, Management Information Systems Concepts, Financial Concepts and Business Law Applications (*students must have a Juris Doctor for Business Law*). The revised curriculum also will feature content threads that will be woven into every course — leadership, strategy, creativity, emotional intelligence, social capital, ethics, technology, global business and management. 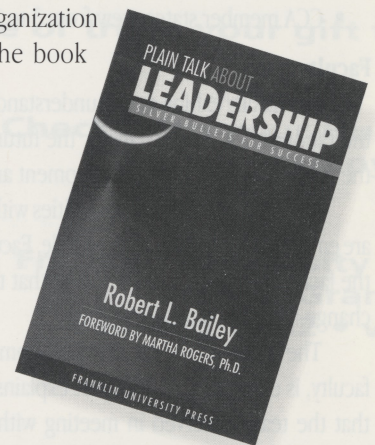
Franklin University Press Book Debuts at Barnes & Noble

Franklin Offers High School Students a Jump Start

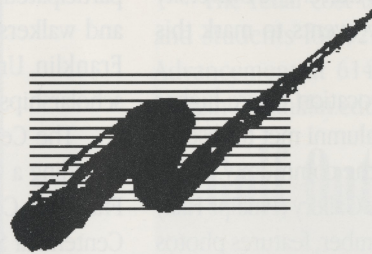

A Year of Celebrations

Franklin University's centennial celebration features a wide variety of events.

Franklin University started the year with a birthday party to celebrate its Centennial. But, the festivities didn't stop there. The University has planned an entire year of community events to mark this historic occasion.

February brought a special Centennial Convocation where higher education representatives, business leaders and alumni met to discuss the future of higher education and its impact on the community.

A historical photo exhibit opened in the Bunte Gallery (Phillips Hall) in March. The exhibit, which continues until November, features photos from Franklin's beginnings at the YMCA downtown to present day. The gallery is open from 8 a.m. - 10 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Friday; 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. - 5 p.m. Sunday.

More than 300 alumni, faculty and staff and community members participated in the Run With Ben in June. This 5K run/walk took runners and walkers through downtown streets and past the YMCA, where Franklin University started. The Run With Ben raised \$4,000 for scholarships at Franklin.

The Centennial Committee has more events scheduled for 2002 including a Gala Dinner Dance on Saturday, Sept. 21, a Block Party in Franklin's Courtyard on Thursday, Oct. 3 and a dedication of a special Centennial Sculpture in November, recognizing trustee Bill Eells who provided the funds for the sculpture.

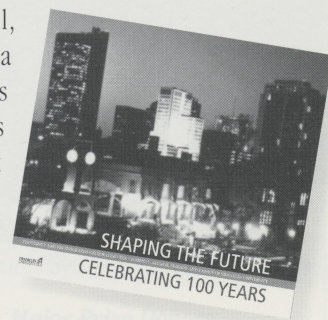

Hundreds of International Students Call Franklin Home

Zhengrong Gu traveled 6,833 miles from Beijing, China to attend Franklin University. She will be graduating Winter '03 with a bachelor's degree in Accounting.

It may seem surprising that Gu traveled across the globe to attend Franklin but she is hardly the exception. Our University is currently home to more than 500 international students from 73 countries. Since Franklin University started accepting international students in 1971, the number of students has grown significantly. In just over a decade Franklin saw international enrollment climb from 40 to 565.

Students come from all over the world for different reasons. In Gu's case, she wanted to pursue a different way of life. "Most young Chinese believe that they have a great chance in the United States to quickly gain knowledge, find a job and have a good life," she said. According to Gu, Chinese colleges are very limiting because there is a fixed curriculum that restricts the number of classes students can take.

Other international students find Franklin University very appealing because of affordable tuition, business related majors, including the Master of Business Administration (MBA), and a smaller, more personalized campus environment.

Franklin University helps international students by being sensitive to the special challenges they face when they arrive in the United States. Franklin University's International Student Services help make the transition from home to the U.S. as easy as possible whether it is helping students find a place to stay or working through immigration issues.

"Sometimes students do not have a place to stay when they first arrive in the United States. That's why we have created the American home-stay program," said Patrick Schumer, Director of International

Student Services, "International students can stay with an American family for one to two weeks until they find an apartment and transportation." Franklin also allows students to have part-time campus jobs to help defray college costs.

"I appreciate Franklin giving international students a chance to have part-time jobs on the campus," Gu said. "It is very helpful for us because many international students have problems with tuition."

Having a diverse international population benefits both international students and American students through exposing students to different cultures. "When international students come here they bring the world with them. They quite often bring with them a perspective that we Americans do not even get in our newspapers," said Phyllis Duryee, Assistant Dean of the Ross School of Management and Leadership. "This is an important lesson to learn together."

The University wants the international students to be successful in their chosen major

and provides ways for students to improve their English including a conversational partner program. This program partners international students with native English speakers so the students can practice their conversation skills.

Franklin's efforts to accommodate international students have definitely paid off for Zhengrong Gu. From her first experience at Franklin, she knew she made the right choice. "I went to Franklin because the people are friendly and very helpful to international students," she said, "The first person I called was an instructor and he was very kind and patient with me." •

Golf Outing Hole in One

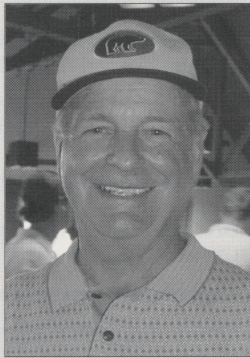

The Office of Institutional Advancement thanks the many sponsors, contributors, players and volunteers who helped make our outing a success.

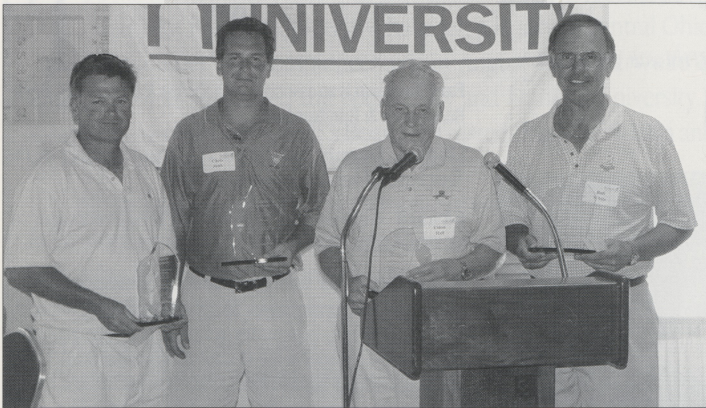
"The alumni support was wonderful," said Mac Ware '88, Golf Outing Chair. "We hope to see even more of our alumni at next year's event."

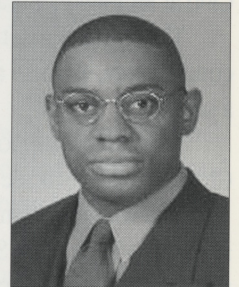
